

**STOCKBRIDGE SELECT BOARD MEETING MINUTES**

**Present:**

**Call to Order:**

Terry called the meeting to order.

**Agenda:**

First item was to take action on the minutes of October 17<sup>th</sup>. Terry made a motion to approve the minutes. Chuck seconded; all were in favor.

Next item was to take action on One-Day Alcohol Permits for the Norman Rockwell Museum on November 9<sup>th</sup> from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. Chuck made a motion to approve the one-day alcohol permit. Roxanne seconded; all were in favor.

Next, Mark acknowledged the annual in lieu of tax payment from the Stockbridge Housing Authority for the property on Pine Street in the amount of \$840.56.

Next was the Special Permit for Tina&Rich, LLC for 33 Nielsen Lane.

The property is in an R-4 zone. The application is filed in the Town Clerk's Office and the Selectmen's Office. The application can be reviewed in either office during normal business hours.

Pam Sandler gave an overview of the proposed project. The house is non-conforming and the addition to the back of the house of a screened porch, deck and additional bedroom, will not increase the non-conformity.

Terry made a motion that the Board approve the special permit as presented for Tina&Rich, LLC at 33 Nielsen Lane. Chuck seconded; all were in approval.

Next on the agenda, Terry announced that there is Zoning Review Meeting on October 28<sup>th</sup> to review the Diagnostic Report by Joel Russell. The meeting will be at 6:30 in the Selectmen's Meeting Room.

#### Announcements and Updates:

Roxanne noted that they will be creating a Lake and Watershed Task Force primarily to bring together all the efforts in terms of preserving the ecosystem of Lake Mahkeenac; working closely with Charlie Kenny and involving the Conservation Commission.

Terry said that they hope to appoint the search committee for the Town Administrator at the November 14<sup>th</sup> meeting. Bronly Boyd will speak to each of the Board members for name suggestions. In the next couple of months, the committee will be working on a job description with hopes of posting the job in January and hopefully selecting a candidate by the end of March.

Mark said that VHB has put down traffic counts at both intersections as a next step. They will also be conducting on-the-ground survey of the layout. Speaking with Mass Highway, Mark said they will be painting the lines and STOP stencil at the fire station intersection, Rt. 102 and Rt. 7. Mark said that Stockbridge and most of the southern Berkshire towns are in the MRF program for recycling and the ten-year contract is expiring in January. They are the only existing vendor for recyclables in this area. New this year is the offering of single stream (bottles/cans/paper) versus dual stream (bottles and cans plus paper separate), which Stockbridge does now. The cost of single stream is more per ton but the cost will need to be analyzed. Next month there will be meeting with MRF representatives to discuss the process.
